## HOLMES FAMILY BIBLE RECORDS

compiled 1966 by

Bonnylyn Holmes Stigall  
Springfield, Mo.

The two Holmes family Bibles concern descendants of George Perry Holmes, b. Feb. 7, 1805 in New York State, m. Aug. 25, 1831, Mary Jane Swindall, b. May 14, 1808 in Georgia. They were my great grandparents.

Grandfather was Lewis Patrick Holmes, b. Feb. 18, 1845 in Georgia. He was married three times. His second wife was Indiana G. Burk (or Burke), b. Dec. 31, 1854 in Arkansas, m. Jan. 15, 1879 at Amity, Ark. Lewis and Indiana's son Daniel Thomas (Dee) Holmes, b. June 26, 1886 at Amity, Ark. was my father.

George P. Holmes lived (by census) in Talbot Co. Ga. in 1850; in Randolph Co. Ga. in 1860; in Washington, Hempstead Co. Ark. in 1870. Date of death or where buried, unknown.

Lewis P. Holmes died Mar. 13, 1907 and is buried at Center Point, Howard Co. Ark.

## SOME SPANISH LAND GRANTS IN THE ST. CHARLES DISTRICT

In 1682 a Frenchman named LaSalle travelled from the Great Lakes region to the mouth of the Mississippi River, taking possession of all the land west of the river in the name of France and calling the country Louisiana in honor of Louis XIV, King of France

By a secret treaty on November 3, 1762, France ceded its colony west of the Mississippi, and the city of New Orleans, to Spain. The French laws and customs which had governed the colony during the French regime were retained, the only new laws of consequence being those providing for the acquisition of land.

St. Louis became the capital of Upper Louisiana which was governed by a lieutenant-governor appointed by the governor-general of New Orleans. The settlements along the Mississippi were divided into districts, each with a commandant appointed by the lieutenant-governor. By the close of the Spanish period there were five of these districts - St. Louis, St. Charles, Ste. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau, and New Madrid.

Failing in her attempt to get the Kentucky and Tennessee regions to withdraw from the Union and fearing an invasion of Louisiana by the British, Spain now adopted the policy of enticing Americans to move to Louisiana by offering liberal land grants to its settlers. During the period of Spanish rule, Americans came in great numbers into Upper Louisiana, lured by the Spanish land grants, the only expense being the fees for surveying and registration.

In 1800, Spain ceded the vast territory back to France, and in 1804 France sold Louisiana to the United States. In 1805, the United States Government established a Board of Commissioners in Missouri to pass on the Spanish Land Grants, most of which were eventually recognized.

These Spanish land grants were especially tempting to Daniel Boone and many of his relatives and friends who had lost their Kentucky lands because of claim-jumpers. Having received favorable reports about the Louisiana Territory from his son Daniel Morgan Boone whom he had sent in 1795 to Upper Louisiana, in the fall of 1799 Daniel Boone decided to accept the invitation of Don Zenon Trudeau, the lieutenant-governor of Upper Louisiana, and move his family to Missouri. As a further inducement to lure Daniel Boone into Upper Louisiana, Don Zenon Trudeau promised generous land grants not only to Daniel Boone but to the families he would bring with him to this Spanish territory, knowing that there were those who were always eager to follow Daniel Boone - whether to Kentucky or to Missouri.

Much has been written about Daniel Boone after he migrated from Kentucky to Missouri, but there is little information about many of those

who came with him. Who were his followers? Why were they willing to "pull up stakes" and follow Boone into an unknown wilderness west of the Mississippi?

Family records, county court records, and county histories answer some of these questions about some of Boone's followers. American State Papers, Vol. II, Public Lands, pp. 363-602, gives the names of land holders in Spanish-governed Upper Louisiana, the numbers of their Spanish Land Grants, the number of arpents or acres in each, the location by township, and the date of the commissioner's certificate.

The following list of Spanish Land Grants pertains mainly to the grantees in the Femme Osage, Dardenne, and Callaway Townships, where the Boone followers usually settled. A few, however, are along the Missouri River in the eastern and southern part of what is now Warren County, originally a part of the St. Charles District.

JOSEPH HAYNES

Grant #14, 170 acres, Femme Osage Township.

Joseph Haynes was with the company of dragoons accompanying General Clark up the Missouri River to Fort Osage. Part of Grant #14 now lies in Defiance, Mo.

WILLIAM STEWART (1776-1839)

Grant #16, 400 arpents, St. Charles Township, December 12, 1808.

In 1798, William Stewart of Virginia settled in Green's Bottom, St. Charles County, Mo. He married Sarah Howell, the oldest daughter of Francis Howell, Sr. Since he came to Missouri with Daniel Boone, I feel that he was related to John Stewart, the first husband of Hannah Boone, the youngest sister of Daniel Boone.

On May 1, 1769, Daniel Boone, John Stewart, a skilled woodsman, and three others set out for Kentucky under the guidance of John Finley. Boone and Stewart, each regarding the other as a brother, usually hunted together, though frequently they separated, meeting every two weeks at their camp. From one of these trips Stewart never returned. Five years later when Boone was cutting the Wilderness Road to Kentucky, one of his companions found a skeleton in a hollow sycamore. There was no rifle, but the powder horn with the body had a brass band with Stewart's initials and was recognized by Boone as having belonged to John Stewart. The left arm was broken, but the skull showed no sign of scalping knife. No one ever knew the secret of John Stewart's death. Nor have I been able to find the relationship between John and William Stewart.

The low number of William Stewart's land grant would indicate that he probably was with Daniel Morgan Boone when he came to Missouri in 1795 at the request of his father Daniel Boone to explore this territory. Later William Stewart exchanged Grant #16 for Grant #56 issued November 18, 1800, to Perry Brown.

DAVID DARST, SR. (1757-1826)

Grant #18, 600 arpents, Femme Osage Township, December 13, 1808.

David Darst, Sr., a native of Shenandoah County, Va., was the founder of the Darst family in the St. Charles District. He, like Daniel Boone, had land troubles in Kentucky; before leaving that state he was given by some of the leading men of Kentucky complimentary letters of introduction to the Spanish authorities in St. Louis.

In 1798, with his wife Rosetta Holman Darst and seven children, he moved from Woodford County, Ky. to the St. Charles District, settling in a valley of the Missouri River that is yet known as Darst Bottom. Since the number of his grant is lower than that of Daniel Morgan Boone, it is quite probable that he, twelve years older than Daniel Morgan, was a member of the scouting party sent into Missouri in 1795 by Daniel Boone. And since Darst's grant and those of Daniel Morgan Boone, Daniel Boone, and David Darst, Jr. were in Darst Bottom and joined one another, it is not surprising that there were many marriages between the Boone and Darst families.

David Darst, Sr. was a member of the first Grand Jury summoned north of the Missouri River.

Near Defiance, Mo., David Darst, Sr., a Revolutionary soldier, was buried in the Old Pleasant Hill Cemetery, adjoining the Pleasant Hill Church which was built on a beautiful site given by the Darst family, overlooking the fertile Darst Bottom.

ISAAC VAN BIBBER (1771-1840)

Grant #19, 400 arpents, Femme Osage Township, December 13, 1808.

Isaac Van Bibber, Jr. was adopted and reared by Daniel Boone. In 1797, in Kentucky, he married Elizabeth Hays, the first white child born in Kentucky and a granddaughter of Daniel Boone. In 1799, Isaac Van Bibber and his wife accompanied her parents (Susannah Boone and William Hays) and the Boones to Missouri.

When Isaac Van Bibber was only 13 years old, he had acted as a scout against the Indians in Virginia; during the Indian Wars in Missouri he was a Major under Col. Daniel Morgan Boone and a spy with Major Dodge.

In 1815, probably attracted by the mineral waters of Loutre Lick in Montgomery County, Mo., Isaac Van Bibber moved his family to a 640 acre tract of land which he had bought from Nathan Boone. Here he built the renowned Van Bibber Tavern.

DANIEL MORGAN BOONE (1769-1839)

Grant #20, 600 arpents, Femme Osage Township, December 13, 1808.

In 1795, Daniel Morgan Boone was sent by his father, Daniel Boone, into what is now St. Charles County, Mo., to see what kind of land lay

west of the Mississippi River. The fertile soil and the abundance of game induced him to move to Missouri. On his land grant the first and the strongest of the forts in this area was built - Boone's Fort. Here, too, was built the first Boone home in Missouri. When Rebecca and Daniel Boone came to Missouri in 1799, they lived until 1804 at the home of their son, Daniel Morgan Boone.

Daniel Morgan Boone made many of the early Government surveys, one of the most important having been the Boone's Lick Road. Like his illustrious father, Daniel Morgan was an explorer, trapper, surveyor, and soldier. He is said to have been the first American-born white man to set foot in Jackson County, Mo. About 1826 he was Indian Agent to the Kaw tribe in Jefferson County, Kans.

Daniel Morgan Boone married Sarah Griffin Lewis. Both were buried in the Boone-Hays Cemetery, Westport Township, Jackson County, Mo.

#### JAMES GREEN

Grant #29, 800 arpents, St. Charles Township, December 13, 1808.

In 1797 James Green, a native of North Carolina, came to Missouri and settled first in St. Louis County. In 1799 he moved to St. Charles County, settling in what has since been known as Green's Bottom along the Missouri River south of Harvester. He was a member of the first Grand Jury summoned north of the Missouri River.

#### CHRISTOPHER ZUMWALT, SR.

Grant #54, 467.88 acres, Cuivre Township, December 22, 1808.

February 6, 1806, Angus Gillis testified before the Board of Land Commissioners that Christopher Zumwalt arrived in St. Charles County in 1799; that he began settlement in 1801; that in 1804 he moved there with his family.

#### JACOB ZUMWALT

Grant #55, 450 arpents, Dardenne Township, December 22, 1808.

Jacob Zumwalt settled in St. Charles County in 1796. In 1798 he built a log house that was used as a fort during the War of 1812. The ruins of this house and fort are now in Fort Zumwalt State Park near O'Fallon, Mo. In 1807 the Rev. Jesse Walker administered the first Methodist sacrament in Missouri at this house. Mrs. Zumwalt made the wine from polk berries and used crusts of corn bread for the bread.

PERRY BROWN

Grant #56, Dardenne Township, 300 acres.

November 18, 1800, this grant was issued to Perry Brown. William Stewart exchanged his Grant #16 for Brown's Grant #56. Much of the grant was owned by Stewart heirs in 1940 when the United States Government acquired the land for a TNT Plant.

NICHOLAS COONTZ (KOUNTZ)

Grant #58, 400 arpents, Dardenne Township.

Nicholas and John Coontz, Germans, came to St. Charles County about 1790. About 1812 they built Coontz Fort, a log structure. After the War of 1812, Nicholas Coontz kept a tavern on the Boone's Lick Road at the old fort. He was in the company of dragoons that accompanied General Clark up the Missouri River to Fort Osage.

SQUIRE BOONE (1744-1815)

Grant #60, 700 arpents, Cuivre Township, December 22, 1808.

In October 1799, when Daniel Boone was moving his family to Missouri, some going overland with the cattle and others by boat, Squire Boone, a younger brother of Daniel, went in the boat with Rebecca Bryan Boone, wife of Daniel, and Daniel Morgan Boone, the oldest living son of Daniel. Squire Boone spent the winter of 1799-1800 and perhaps a year or two in Missouri. On his land grant in Cuivre Township, about 20 or 30 miles from his brother, he started to build a stone house. When it was about half finished, two of his sons came to Missouri and persuaded him to return to Kentucky. His family, tired of so much moving, had refused to go to Missouri with him and had remained in Shelby County, Ky.

JAMES FLANGHERTY

Grant #64, 600 arpents, St. Charles Township, December 22, 1808.

James Flangherty settled in Green's Bottom in October, 1799. In 1804 he was appointed a Justice of the Peace for the St. Charles District, being one of the first under the American Government. He was a member of the first Grand Jury summoned north of the Missouri River and a member of the Territorial Council from St. Charles, about 1812.

FLANDERS CALLAWAY (1752-1829)

Grants #108 and #299, 600 arpents and 200 arpents, Femme Osage Township, January 5, 1809 and November 29, 1809.

In October 1799, Flanders Callaway, a Virginian, with his wife Jemima Boone and his family came to the St. Charles District with his father-in-law, Daniel Boone, and other families accompanying Boone into Upper

Louisiana, all looking for fertile land and future homes. His name has been preserved in the county by the stream, Callaway Creek, which crossed his land and by the ruggedly beautiful area through which this stream flows known as Callaway Forks and by Callaway Township, adjoining Femme Osage Township. From St. Charles County, Flanders Callaway moved farther west, about 14 miles, to Warren County where prior to the War of 1812 he built Callaway's Post. He and his wife died in Warren County and were buried in the nearby David Bryan Cemetery where Rebecca and Daniel Boone had been buried.

JOSHUA DODSON (d. ca. 1816)

Grant #208, 400 arpents, Femme Osage Township, March 27, 1809.

Joshua Dodson, son of Eugenia Smith and Isaac Dodson of Virginia, came from the Ste. Genevieve District of Missouri to the St. Charles District where in August 1801, he married Susannah Hays; he settled in the Femme Osage Township near his father-in-law, William Hays, a son-in-law of Daniel Boone. Joshua Dodson was with the company of dragoons accompanying General Clark up the Missouri River to Fort Osage.

ADAM ZUMWALT (son of Andrew)

Grant #294, 600 arpents, Cuivre Township.

In 1797, Adam Zumwalt placed his family and stock on a flat boat and came down the Ohio River and up the Mississippi to St. Charles. He settled east of the present village of Flint Hill. Chief Black Hawk, at a nearby Indian encampment, was a frequent visitor in the Zumwalt home until the beginning of the Indian Wars.

ANDREW ZUMWALT, SR.

Grant #296, 580 arpents, Dardenne Township, November 22, 1809.

This grant joined #460, once the property of Capt. James Callaway and his wife, Nancy Howell, a daughter of Francis Howell, Sr. After Capt. Callaway was killed in 1815 by the Indians at Loutre River, his widow married John Harrison Castlio. Grant #296, prior to 1885, belonged to their son, John Callaway Castlio. Until 1940 when the Government acquired the land, it belonged to descendants of John H. Castlio and Nancy Howell Callaway Castlio. It is now a part of the Busch Wildlife Area.

JEREMIAH CLAY

Grant #300, 279 acres, Femme Osage Township, December 2, 1809.

This grant of 279 acres in the western part of the Femme Osage Township was issued to Jeremiah Clay. Later it was the home of Elijah Bryan (1799-1896) and the birthplace of William Smith Bryan (1846-

1940), a grandson of Jonathan Bryan and co-author of Pioneer Families of Missouri. William Smith Bryan was also the author of many articles about Daniel Boone and the Boone family, having obtained much of his information from his father who knew the Boones intimately, having grown up within sight of the Boone home.

JONATHAN BRYAN (1759-1846)

Grant #301, 527 acres, Femme Osage Township, December 2, 1809.

Jonathan Bryan was one of the six children of Rebecca Enox and James Bryan of North Carolina who, after the death of their mother, were reared by their cousin, Rebecca Bryan Boone, wife of Daniel Boone. When the Boones moved to Kentucky, James Bryan followed with his six children; there his three daughters were married at the home of Rebecca and Daniel Boone. Later James and his three sons followed the Boones to Missouri. James lived with his son Jonathan in the Femme Osage District where their nearest neighbor was Daniel Boone who lived with his son Nathan and family. In all of Daniel Boone's land controversies in Missouri, Jonathan was his witness and staunch friend. In 1801, Jonathan Bryan built the first grist mill north of the Missouri River, for several years supplying all the settlements between St. Charles and Loutre Island with meal and flour. He was a member of the first Grand Jury summoned north of the Missouri River. On the rocky hillside above his house and mill, Jonathan Bryan, his wife, Mary Hughes Coshow, and his father, James Bryan, were buried. In 1931 the St. Charles Chapter of the DAR marked the grave of James Bryan, a Revolutionary soldier, but the graves of Jonathan and his wife are marked by rough, crude stones only.

MICAJAH CALLAWAY in favor of THOMAS SMITH

Grant #303, 800 arpents, Femme Osage Township, December 2, 1809.

Micajah Callaway was a brother of Flanders Callaway who married Jemima Boone, second daughter of Daniel Boone. Thomas Smith of Virginia settled first in Kentucky. From there he came to Missouri and settled in the Femme Osage Township where he married the oldest daughter of David Darst, Sr. After the death of Mary Darst, he married in 1806, her younger sister, Elizabeth Darst. Thomas Smith was a ranger in the company of Capt. James Callaway, a grandson of Daniel Boone. In his saddle bags, Smith carried from Kentucky the gun-lock that was on Capt. Callaway's gun when he was killed by the Indians at Loutre River in 1815. It was a waterproof flint lock of a superior make and fitted so closely that water could not penetrate to the powder. In 1818 Thomas Smith settled in Callaway County, Mo. and established Smith's Landing, now St. Aubert. August 15, 1834, Squire Boone (son of Nancy Linville and George Boone, a brother of Daniel) sold Grant #303 to Thomas Parsons, one of the early settlers in Defiance, Mo.

DR. WARREN COTTLE

Grants #354-753, 640 acres, Dardenne Township.

Dr. Warren Cottle of Vermont came to Missouri in 1799. His son Ira Cottle received Grant #353, 340 acres in Dardenne Township. His son Lorenzo Cottle founded the town of Cottleville, Mo. in 1840.

DAVID BRYAN (1757-1835)

Grant #382, 400 arpents, on Teuque Creek, St. Charles District, June 19, 1810.

Though Grant #382, on Teuque Creek, is now in Warren County, Mo., when it was issued to David Bryan it was in the St. Charles District. In October 1799, David Bryan came to Missouri with his father James Bryan, his two brothers, Jonathan and Henry, and the Boones. The first American settlement within the present limits of Warren County was made by David Bryan in 1800. About two miles southeast of the present town of Marthasville, David Bryan built a double hewed log house which about 1870 was replaced by a two-story brick house still standing (1965). A short distance west of his house he reserved one-half acre of ground on a knoll above Teuque Creek for a family cemetery, said to have been the first Protestant cemetery west of the Mississippi River. It was in this cemetery that Rebecca and Daniel Boone were buried. Later Mary and David Bryan were buried at the feet of Rebecca (David's first cousin and mother to him after the death of his mother) and Daniel Boone, though today no stones mark their graves nor those of Jemima Boone and Flanders Callaway who were buried, too, in the little family cemetery.

David Bryan, like his father James Bryan, served in the Revolution; he was one of the Bryans defending Bryan Station in Kentucky in 1782; in 1812 he served under Commodore Perry in the Battle of Lake Erie.

Henry Bryan, the youngest of the three Bryan brothers, settled, too, on Teuque Creek. At one time his grandson, Dr. John H. Davis, a physician and surgeon of Warren County, lived on Grant #382.

WILLIAM HANCOCK

Grant #383, 600 acres, Missouri River, St. Charles District.

This tract of land issued to William Hancock, just west of the St. Charles County-Warren County boundary line and just across the river from Washington, Mo., lies between the Missouri River and Highway 47. In Kentucky William Hancock fought Indians, guarded forts, and experienced the dangers of the time. He was one of the first Americans to come to Missouri and one of the first settlers in Warren County on the Missouri River bottom, later known as Hancock's Bottom. In St. Charles County he married a Miss McClain.

JAMES MITCHELL

Grant #384, 595 acres, Femme Osage Township.

Grant #384 on the Missouri River between Grants #1721 of John Bell and #1246 of John Zumwalt was issued to James Mitchell. On August 27, 1806, James Piper swore before the Board of Land Commissioners that claimant began settlement in October 1803; that he cleared some land, cut logs for house, and in 1804 raised a crop of corn on same and fenced in what he had cleared.

JOHN PARKETT

Grant #417, 650 arpents, Dardenne Township, July 31, 1810.

In 1806 John Castlio (1764-1830) of North Carolina and Nashville, Tenn., came with his family to Upper Louisiana, settling first near the present village of Cottleville, Mo. In 1811, after the death of his wife, Eleanor Harrison Lowe Castlio, he moved to Howell's Prairie where on Grant #417, issued originally to John Parkett, he built Castlio Fort, one room of which today (1965) is part of the dwelling there.

GODFREY KRAH (CROW)

Grant #424, 510 acres, Dardenne Township.

This tract of land in Dardenne Township was issued by the Spanish Government to Godfrey Krah (Crow). After he died, leaving a widow Sarah Crow, the Spanish Government conceded the land to Lewis Crow who in March 1814, sold it to Capt. James Callaway, a grandson of Daniel Boone. In 1851, Othaniel Caleb Castlio (1824-1871), a son of John Harrison Castlio and Nancy Howell Callaway Castlio (widow of Capt. James Callaway) with part of the \$5,000 he had brought from the gold fields of California bought from the widow Stephenson 600 acres of land, part of which was the southeast section of Grant #424, now part of the Busch Wildlife Area.

JOHN CROW

Grant #438, 382 acres, Femme Osage Township.

This grant of 382 acres west of Augusta, Mo. was issued to John Crow and later became the property of James Bigelow (1822-1892), a son of Moses Bigelow of Pennsylvania and Parthena Bryan, a daughter of Mary Hughes Coshow and Jonathan Bryan. James Bigelow was born in St. Charles County two years after his parents came to Missouri, was reared on his father's farm, and was never out of the state but once when he walked over the bridge at St. Louis so that he could say he had been "abroad". He held the office of Justice of the Peace for over 20 years.

JOHN HOWELL (1781-1869)

Grant #453, 405.50 arpents, Dardenne Township, September 6, 1810.

John Howell was the oldest son of Susannah Stone and Francis Howell, Sr. He was a private in the company of rangers commanded by his brother-

in-law, Capt. James Callaway, and was in the company of dragoons which accompanied General Clark up the Missouri to Fort Osage. He married Grace Baldrige, a daughter of Robert Baldrige. He was buried in the Old Dardenne Cemetery, St. Charles County, Mo.

JEREMIAH GROJEAN

Grant #460, 200 arpents, Dardenne Township, September 8, 1810.

This grant, issued to Lewis Crow in favor of Jeremiah Grojean, later became the property of Capt. James Callaway (1783-1815), the second son of Flanders Callaway and Jemima Boone, the second daughter of Daniel Boone. On May 9, 1805, James Callaway married Nancy Howell, the second daughter of Francis Howell, Sr. James Callaway built his cabin on this tract of land on Kraut Run in the northwestern part of Howell's Prairie. Here Nancy Howell Callaway and her three children lived the ten brief years of her married life. Callaway's duties as captain of a company of rangers kept him away from home much of the time. It was on the doorstep of the cabin on this land that Nancy fainted when word was brought to her that her husband had been killed in an Indian ambush on Loutre River, March 7, 1815. Callaway County, Mo. was named for this grandson of Daniel Boone.

WILLIAM T. LAMME (1777-1840)

Grants #758, #759, 640 acres each, village of Charette, June 1, 1811.

Grant #758, near the village of Charette in what is now Warren County, Mo. was issued with settlement rights to Jean Marie Cardinal in favor of William T. Lamme; Grant #759, near the same village, was issued with settlement rights to Joseph Arnois in favor of William T. Lamme. William T. Lamme, a son of Robert Lamme of Bourbon County, Ky., settled in what is now Warren County, Mo. in 1803. On August 9, 1803, he married Frances Callaway, a daughter of Flanders Callaway and Jemima Boone, daughter of Daniel Boone. He was a 1st Lieutenant\* and Adjutant of Boone's Missouri Mounted Volunteers in 1814. He was a well-educated man who left his family in excellent circumstances. On a knoll in his peach orchard near his home on Grant #758 he reserved ground for a family cemetery in which he, his wife, several children, and relatives were buried.

FRANCIS HOWELL, SR. (1762-1834)

Grant #887, 700 arpents, Dardenne Township, June 10, 1811.

Like the Boones and the Bryans, the Howells came from the British Isles to Pennsylvania; from Pennsylvania to North Carolina, and on to Missouri. In 1795, Francis Howell, Sr., a son of the Revolutionary soldier, John Howell, Sr., came to Upper Louisiana with his wife Susannah Stone and seven children and settled in what is now St. Louis County. In 1800 he moved across the Missouri River to an area that was soon known as Howell's Prairie. On Grant #887 Francis Howell, Sr. built Howell's Fort, the second in St.

Charles County, a grist mill, and his home, a large frame house. In 1940 when the Government acquired most of the land in Howell's Prairie for a TNT Plant, nearly all the buildings in the area were destroyed - churches, schools, and homes, one of which was the house built by Francis Howell, the oldest frame building on the Prairie. Where once Francis Howell had made gunpowder for the War of 1812, about 150 years after the Government was producing the highly explosive trinitrotoluene. Francis and Susannah Howell and many descendants were buried in the little family cemetery near his home and fort.

Of all the families that came with Daniel Boone to Missouri, not one, except the Bryan, was bound more closely to the Boone family by many marriages than the Howell. Three of the children of Francis Howell, Sr., married three of the children of Jemima Boone and Flanders Callaway, and a fourth married a Callaway granddaughter; Thomas Howell married Susannah Callaway; Nancy Howell married Capt. James Callaway; Susannah Howell married Larkin Callaway, and Lewis Howell married Serena Lamme, a daughter of Frances Callaway and William T. Lamme. There were many others in addition to these four marriages.

#### JAMES DAVIS

Grants #970-1307, 340 acres, Femme Osage Township, June 12, 1811.

This land was issued to James Davis who with his brother John came to Missouri from Pennsylvania in 1800. James married Jemima Hays, a daughter of William Hays and Susannah Boone, oldest daughter of Daniel Boone. A brother Jonathan Davis married Mahala Hays, a sister of Jemima Hays Davis. John Davis married Susan Bryan, a daughter of Elizabeth Sparks and Henry Bryan, the third and youngest son of Rebecca Enox and James Bryan. On December 13, 1804, as a result of a quarrel and misunderstanding over some cleared land, James Davis shot his father-in-law, William Hays. As syndic of the Femme Osage District, Daniel Boone had to investigate this murder case in which the victim was a son-in-law and the defendant a grandson-in-law and hunting companion. About 1819 James Davis moved to Montgomery County, Mo., settling in Section 29, Township 48, Range 6. A hunter and trapper by profession, Davis' eccentricities gave color to the Boone settlement.

#### JAMES BEATTY

Grant #991, 640 acres, Dardenne Township, June 14, 1811.

Grant #991, the site of the village of Mechanicsville, later Howell, was issued to James Beatty, April 16, 1835, the land was sold for taxes and purchased by James Silvey. On January 16, 1853, Fortunatus Boone Castlio (a son of Nancy Howell Callaway Castlio and John Harrison Castlio) bought the land for \$904.73, and in 1866 he and his father laid out the village of Mechanicsville. In 1940 when the Government acquired much of Dardenne Township for the TNT Plant, all the homes in the village were destroyed, forcing the villagers many of whom were descendants of the pioneers who

had settled and cultivated the land, to seek homes elsewhere.

JOHN ZUMWALT

Grant #1246, 640 acres, Femme Osage Township.

John Zumwalt settled in Darst Bottom, St. Charles County, Mo. in 1806. He married Elizabeth Conrad, and their son Henry Zumwalt married Jemima Boone, a daughter of Nathan Boone and Olive Van Bibber Boone. A daughter, Elizabeth Zumwalt, married on March 10, 1814, William Coshow, a step-son of Jonathan Bryan and the purchaser on May 6, 1815, of 161 acres of Daniel Boone's land on the Missouri River.

JAMES KERR

Grant #1641, 1020 acres, Dardenne Township.

Dardenne Creek flows through this grant issued to James Kerr, and the Old Dardenne Cemetery joins the northwest corner of the land. On June 14, 1806, Andrew Zumwalt being duly sworn testified before the Board of Land Commissioners that claimant began settlement of same in 1799; that he did prior to and on the 1st day of October, 1800, actually inhabit and cultivate same and was at the time of obtaining said concession the head of a family.

DAVID DARST, JR. (1795-1869)

Grant #1643, 224 acres, Femme Osage Township.

In 1798 David Darst, Jr. came from Kentucky with his father, David Darst, Sr., of Virginia, to an area in St. Charles County that is yet known as Darst Bottom. The grant of David Darst, Jr. adjoined Grant #1646 issued to Daniel Boone. On September 10, 1816, in St. Louis, David Darst, Jr. married Mary Thompson, a daughter of Margaret and Alexander Thompson. Though young, he received grant because he was a cripple.

ISAAC DARST (1789-1852)

Grant #1644, 297 acres, Femme Osage Township.

Grant #1644, east of the present town of Augusta, was issued to Isaac Darst, the fourth child and second son of Rosetta Holman and David Darst, Sr. Isaac married Phoebe Bryan, daughter of Mary Hughes Coshow and Jonathan Bryan. Isaac Darst and his wife were buried in the Isaac Darst Cemetery in the Femme Osage Township.

DANIEL BOONE (1734-1820)

Grant #1646, 450 acres, Femme Osage Township, April 12, 1814.

Daniel Boone, like many of his kinsmen and fellow Kentuckians, discovered that the land he had fought for, surveyed, cleared, and cultivated

did not belong to him, but because of "shingled" land claims to someone else. Often the persons claiming the Kentucky lands had never been in Kentucky and had not experienced the hardships and dangers that Daniel Boone and the heroic few had braved to protect and defend land they naturally believed to be theirs.

Daniel Boone decided to accept the invitation of Don Zenon Trudeau, Lieutenant-Governor of Upper Louisiana, and to take his family and others - for there were always those eager to follow him - to this new land west of the Mississippi River where he had been promised a large land grant for himself and smaller grants for the families accompanying him. In October 1799, Daniel Boone arrived in Missouri and chose as his land, granted by the Spanish Government, a fertile tract of Missouri River bottom. Because of his services to his country, the Spanish Government did not exact of him the same requirements imposed upon other grantees. Therefore he did not build upon his land, but, because of his age, lived with his sons, first Daniel Morgan Boone whose land joined that of his father and after 1804, with Nathan Boone on Grant #1794. When the United States purchased the Louisiana Territory in 1804, it refused to recognize the agreement between the Spanish Government and Daniel Boone. Finally, however, on April 12, 1814, Congress confirmed Daniel Boone's Spanish title to the land.

On September 26, 1820, Daniel Boone died in the stone house in the Femme Osage Valley he had helped his son Nathan build. He was buried in the David Bryan Cemetery in Warren County, Mo. near the body of his wife, Rebecca Bryan Boone, who had died March 18, 1813.

#### ADAM MARTIN

Grant #1673, 510 acres, Femme Osage Township.

This grant west of Augusta, Mo. was issued to Adam Martin. On September 7, 1808, Kinkead Caldwell swore before the Board of Land Commissioners that a man by the name of Price was gathering corn on tract claimed in October 1803, by Martin. Price also told Caldwell that claimant had employed him to make improvements and since had told him that claimant had paid him, said Price, 2 cows and calves for the same. Testified that the place claimed is a frontier situation and that Indians were troublesome at the time. Phoebe Wallace swore that claimant on December 20, 1803, had a wife and 9 children, 8 of them living with claimant.

#### JOHN SCOTT

Grant #1696, 428.35 acres, Dardenne Township.

Dardenne Creek flows through this grant, west of Cottleville, Mo., issued to John Scott. The 1875 Atlas of St. Charles County (page 19) shows that at one time this land belonged to Zachariah Moore, a "farmer and trader of Mechanicsville". In 1810 Zachariah Moore of Maryland with his wife Elsie Born (Alice Born?) and 8 children settled in St. Charles County on

the Missouri River. A daughter Coner Moore married John W. Boone, a great-grandson of Benjamin Boone, an uncle of Daniel Boone.

THOMAS HOWELL (1783-1869)

Grants #1773-1798, 350 and 640 acres, Dardenne Township.

Thomas Howell, the second child and second son of Susannah Stone and Francis Howell, Sr., was born in Caswell County, N. Car. On July 10, 1806, in St. Charles County, Mo., he married Susannah Callaway, a daughter of Jemima Boone and Flanders Callaway. Susannah Callaway was born January 4, 1791, Boone's Station, Ky.; she died December 25, 1876, Howell's Prairie, St. Charles County.

In 1813, Thomas Howell was trumpeter in the first company of rangers raised by his brother-in-law, Capt. James Callaway. He was sergeant in the company of dragoons accompanying General Clark up the Missouri to Fort Osage.

His spacious red brick house was not built on either of these land grants but in the southwest corner of Grant #1669. About 100 yards from the site of his house is the Thomas Howell Cemetery where he and his wife and numerous descendants and relatives are buried. In 1940 his house was destroyed when the Government acquired most of Howell's Prairie for a TNT Plant. After World War II, when the land was declared surplus, it was given to the University of Missouri.

WILLIAM HAYS (1754-1804)

Grant #1670, 510 acres, Femme Osage Township.

Capt. William Hays was a North Carolinian of Scotch or Irish ancestry. A weaver by trade and better educated than most of his associates, he is said to have taught Daniel Boone "some in writing and improved hand" while living at Fort Blackmore on the Clinch River in Virginia where in 1775 he married Susannah Boone, the oldest daughter of Daniel Boone. He accompanied his father-in-law on the expedition to cut the Wilderness Road in Kentucky and took part in the siege of Boonesborough. In 1799 when the Boones moved to Missouri, William Hays and William Hays, Jr. were with the group that went overland. December 13, 1804, William Hays was killed by his son-in-law, James Davis (see Grant #970). Since much of Grant #1670 was Missouri bottom land, his grave and that of his wife who died in 1800 were destroyed by flood waters years ago. On June 26, 1818, when this land was sold at public sale, because the heirs of William Hays desired a partition of the estate, William T. Lamme, a nephew of William Hays and a son-in-law of Jemima Boone and Flanders Callaway, was the highest bidder.

NATHANIEL SIMMONDS

Grant #1776, 255 acres, Dardenne Township.

Nathaniel Simmonds of New England came to St. Charles County at an early date and at one time owned a portion of the site of the present

village of Cottleville. He was with the company of dragoons accompanying General Clark up the Missouri to Fort Osage.

Grant #1777, 640 acres, Cuivre Township.

Lewis Crow was a ranger in the company commanded by Capt. James Callaway, grandson of Daniel Boone.

JOHN McCONNELL

Grant #1785, 640 acres, Dardenne Township.

On February 12, 1806, before the Board of Land Commissioners, James Baldrige, being duly sworn, said that the claimant, John McConnell, sometime in December 1803, at the age of 21, did cultivate said tract of land. Peter Teague swore that the land was actually cultivated prior to and on December 20, 1803, when he resided with his father and that his improvements and those of his father were adjoining, and that about two years ago claimant married and moved on said land with his family and has resided there since. Grant #1785 and Grant #1784 of Peter Teague are west of Harvester, Mo.

JAMES VAN BIBBER

Grant #1793, 362 acres, Femme Osage Township.

James Van Bibber was a son of Margery Bounds and Peter Van Bibber, originally of Holland, who with his brother Isaac Van Bibber, Sr., came to America prior to the Revolution and settled in Botetourt County, Va. James Van Bibber was a brother of Olive Van Bibber, wife of Nathan Boone, and a first cousin of Isaac Van Bibber, Jr., who was adopted by Daniel Boone. In 1803, James Van Bibber settled in St. Charles County. He was coroner at the time William Hays was killed by James Davis. In 1817 he moved to Callaway County, Mo. and settled on the Auxvasses. James Van Bibber's Grant #1793 joined #1794 of his brother-in-law, Nathan Boone, and partly surrounded Grant #301 of Jonathan Bryan.

NATHAN BOONE (1781-1856)

Grant #1794, 680 acres, Femme Osage Township, April 12, 1814.

Nathan Boone, a lad of 18, was in the boat that was to carry his mother, Rebecca Bryan Boone, the children, and the household goods from Kentucky to Missouri. At Limestone, Ky. he decided to return to the Little Sandy, a distance of 75 miles, to marry Olive Van Bibber, the 16-year-old daughter of Peter and Margery Bounds Van Bibber. After the marriage, September 26, 1799, the young couple started to Upper Louisiana. Since bachelors and newcomers without property had to wait three or four years before they could

secure Spanish land grants, Daniel Boone was very much concerned because his youngest son could not acquire land.

Grant #1794, containing 680 acres, had been issued to Robert Hall, January 23, 1798. On January 20, 1800, Nathan Boone "traded off his last horse, including saddle and bridle valued at \$120" to Robert Hall for this land, with the understanding that if Robert Hall returned to the county within twelve months and paid Nathan \$120 and also paid for all the improvements made by Nathan, Hall was to regain possession of the land. Robert Hall did not return to claim the land. Here Daniel and Nathan Boone built the large stone house in which Daniel Boone died September 26, 1820, and in which Nathan and his family lived until January 24, 1837, when Nathan sold the house and land and moved to Ash Grove, Greene County, Mo.

Nathan Boone took a prominent part in the War of 1812; in 1813 he became a Major of the Missouri Mounted Rangers; in 1820 he was a delegate to the Constitutional Convention; he fought in the Black Hawk War; he was Captain of the First United States Dragoons; in 1847 he became Major of the First Regiment of Dragoons and Lieutenant-Colonel of the Second Regiment in 1850, retiring from military service in 1853. He died at his home in Ash Grove. He and his wife were buried in the little family cemetery near their home.

#### ROBERT BALDRIDGE

Grant #1807, 640 acres, Callaway Township.

Robert Baldrige, a native of Ireland, came to America and settled in Kentucky. From there he migrated to Missouri, being one of the first settlers in St. Charles County. A son J. Baldrige (either John or James) received Grant #931 in Callaway Township containing 640 acres on which Pond Fort was built, on the Boone's Lick Road. John Baldrige was a ranger in Capt. James Callaway's company during the Indian wars. At the close of the war he moved to Gasconade County, Mo., where he built a large saw mill. Robert's son James Baldrige married Margaret Zumwalt and his daughter Grace married John Howell, the oldest son of Francis Howell, Sr.

#### NEWTON HOWELL (1790-1864)

Grant #2990, 297.55 acres, Dardenne Township.

This grant on the Missouri River east of the former village of Hamburg, Mo., was issued to Newton Howell, a son of Susanna Stone and Francis Howell, Sr. He was born in Newbury County, S. Car., where the Howell family lived for a few years because of Indian hostilities in North Carolina. In St. Charles County, on September 1, 1811, he married Mrs. Rachel Zumwalt Long; on May 20, 1860, in Warren County, Mo. he married Adelia A. Farris. Newton Howell was a private in the company of dragoons accompanying General Clark up the Missouri to Fort Osage. He was one of the earliest settlers in Warren County, having settled about 3-1/2 miles northeast of Warrenton about 1814.

## ALEXANDER MCKINNEY GRAVEYARD

## WARREN COUNTY, MO.

On a ridge about a mile west of Hopewell (State Route 47 between Warrenton and Marthasville, Mo.) and about 100 yards down the second road leading to the left as one leaves Hopewell on Route N are four graves, just a few feet to the left of the county road. They are obscured by trees and underbrush but easily found because of the heavy growth of myrtle, a ground cover for most of the old cemeteries in this part of Missouri. There are four stones and one rough stone without any inscription which looks as if it marks a grave.

The largest stone, near a very large tree, marks the grave of Alexander McKinney.

Alexander McKinney, born Oct. 7, 1787, died Dec. 7, 1840, 53y 2m

Second largest grave stone.

Julia A. Harnett, wife of James Harnett, Jr., daughter of the late Alec and Nancy McKinney, May 20, 1843, age 18y 9m

Two small stones side by side.

James M., son of J. and M. Callaway, died Dec. 6, 1841, age 1m 12d

Bascom, son of J. and M. J. Callaway, died Sept. 3, 1853, age 5m 11d

Alexander McKinney was the first husband of Nancy Bryan, the 3rd child and 3rd daughter of Mary Hughes Coshow and Jonathan Bryan, son of James Bryan, son of Morgan Bryan and Martha Strode.

The two children were sons of James Callaway (son of Elizabeth Caton and John Boone Callaway, son of Flanders Callaway and Jemima Boone, daughter of Daniel Boone) and Mary Jane McKinney, daughter of Nancy Bryan and Alexander McKinney.

On Sept. 18, 1958, my husband and I literally stumbled upon these graves while trying unsuccessfully to find a Howard cemetery in the Hopewell vicinity. I doubt that any other interested persons know the locations of these graves. We found only one elderly man who knew about where they were.

## DR. JOHN JONES FARM AND CEMETERY

## WARREN COUNTY, MO.

Survey 837, a 640 acre tract of land in Warren County, Mo. was issued by the Spanish Government to the widow St. Franceway. The Commissioner's Certificate was dated June 8, 1811. This grant later became the property of Dr. John Jones.

Dr. John Jones, a son of Giles Jones of Wales, settled in Marthasville, Mo. in 1817 where he began the practice of medicine. On October 22, 1818, in St. Charles County, Mo. he married Minerva Callaway, the youngest daughter and next to the youngest child of Flanders Callaway and Jemima Boone, the second daughter and the fourth child of Rebecca Bryan and Daniel Boone.

About 1-1/2 miles northwest of Marthasville, on Spanish Grant 837, Dr. John Jones built a large two-story brick house with large chimneys at each end. His house, on a line between Range 2 West and Range 1 West, was built on a high knoll above Fallen Timber Creek. From this vantage point it would seem that Indians could not easily sneak upon the family, though an assassin did.

Dr. Jones was a man of rare ability and soon became one of the most prominent and successful physicians in the state, his practice extending over nearly all of what now forms the eastern central counties of Missouri. He served for many years as surgeon of the State Militia. He attended Daniel Boone, his grand-father-in-law, during his last illness.

Because Dr. Jones took an active part in ferreting out counterfeiters and horse thieves in the country, he incurred the enmity of the gang and was murdered while standing in his yard January 22, 1842, by an assassin who was concealed in the woods near the house. The entire community was thrown into a state of excitement. Patrols were organized and a thorough search was made for the murderer, though his identity could never be ascertained. According to local tradition, Fallen Timber Creek was high at the time, even overflowing its banks, and it was easy for the assassin to escape through the flood waters and nearby woods.

Though the people of the area had lost the services of this fine physician, fortunately several young men had had the privilege of studying medicine under Dr. Jones in his home, one of whom was Dr. Elijah McLean who for many years was a prominent physician in Washington, Mo.

Dr. John Jones was buried to the left of his little daughter, Emiline E. Jones, who was born September 8, 1829 and died September 1, 1830. His stone gives the date of his birth as 1789; his death, January 22, 1842. Later his wife was buried to the left of her husband, and the three graves were enclosed by a wall four or five feet high made of large cut stones. Minerva Callaway Jones' stone gives the date of her birth as October 25, 1801, and the date of her death as November 24, 1850.

Outside and right against the south end of the stone wall is an iron fence enclosing the grave of Eliza Ann Jones, the sixth child of Minerva Callaway and Dr. John Jones. The inscription on her stone reads: "Eliza

Ann, wife of Francis Wyatt, died April 27, 1855, age 23 years, 6 months, and 2 days." Nearby a stone on the ground bore this inscription: "Eliza Ann, daughter of Francis and Eliza Ann Wyatt, died July 22, 1855, age 3 months, 2 days."

On March 16, 1965, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Schoppenhorst, life-long residents in the Marthasville area, my husband, A. Ray Oliver, and I visited the little Jones family cemetery on a knoll about four or five hundred yards north of the Jones house.

Several large trees have grown up within the stone wall, pushing over the middle section of the east wall and dislodging many of the other large stones.

Just outside the stone wall was a flat stone, with a Masonic emblem, lying on the ground. The inscription was: "In loving memory of my beloved father, Elisha H. Lack, born September 25, 1818; died November 9, 1846. A loving husband, a brother dear, a father, brother and friend is resting here."

Caroline Jones, the second child and oldest daughter of Dr. John Jones (born July 7, 1822, Warren Co. Mo.; died Apr. 5, 1912, Boone Co. Mo.) married on Mar. 9, 1842, Warren Co. Mo., Elisha H. Lack. After his death, in Warren Co. Mo. on Jan. 26, 1851, she married Newton Bryan, a son of Malinda Morgan and James Bryan, a son of David Bryan and Mary Poor.

A small stone on the ground bore this inscription: "Daughter of E. H. and C. S. Lack, born October 21, 1841; died April 21, 1846. Lightly angels bore her / From the world of sin. / Lightly oped the gates of heaven / My sister entered in."

Fallen from their bases were two stones resembling short obelisks. One: "In memory of William Cook, born January 1st, 1810; died October 19, 1865." The other: "In memory of Sallie M. Cook, wife of William Cook, deceased. Born July 30, 1810; died August 22, 1872."

Ella May Howard (a daughter of John A. Howard and Mary Frances E. Bryan who was a daughter of Willis Bryan-son of David Bryan-and of Czarina Lamme-daughter of Frances Callaway and William T. Lamme) married September 24, 1879 in Warren County, Mo., Samuel B. Cook, a son of Sarah M. Kelly and William Cook, Jr., a merchant of Front Royal, Va., who in 1865 settled near Marthasville where he died in the fall of that year.

## DAVID BRYAN CEMETERY

WARREN COUNTY, MO.

About one mile east of Marthasville, Mo. and one mile north of State Route 47, Survey 382, Charette Township, Warren County, Mo.

David Bryan was the oldest of the six children of Rebecca Enox and James Bryan (son of Morgan Bryan and Martha Strode) who after the death of their mother were reared by their cousin Rebecca Bryan Boone (daughter of Joseph Bryan, son of Morgan Bryan and Martha Strode). James Bryan and his three sons accompanied Daniel and Rebecca Bryan Boone to the Femme Osage District, St. Charles County, Mo.

In 1813, Rebecca Bryan Boone was buried in the little family cemetery which was a few hundred feet from the home of David Bryan (Survey 382) whom she had reared. In 1820 when Daniel Boone died, the men digging the grave beside that of his wife unearthed a human skull. Because of the steep hill on the other side of Rebecca's grave, a spot either at the head or the foot of her grave was chosen for her husband, Daniel Boone. Because of this incident, many of Daniel Boone's descendants think that his body still rests on the hillside above Teuque Creek and not beside that of his wife in the beautiful cemetery at Frankfort, Ky.

The prominent marker in the David Bryan Cemetery designating the original burial place of Rebecca and Daniel Boone bears this inscription:

In this old cemetery are a number of crude, rough stones from which inscriptions, if ever there were any, have been obliterated:

David Bryan (b. Oct. 29, 1757, Rowan Co. N. Car., d. Mar. 20, 1837, Warren Co. Mo.) and his wife Mary Poor (Power, Powell?) (d. July 7, 1836, Warren Co. Mo.) rest in unmarked graves in this cemetery. My mother, Serena Castlio Hays, in her family records, states that David Bryan and his wife were buried at the feet of Rebecca and Daniel Boone.

Jemima Boone (b. Oct. 4, 1762, N. Car., d. Aug. 30, 1834, Warren Co. Mo.) and her husband, Flanders Callaway (b. Dec. 9, 1752, d. Feb. 22, 1829, Warren Co. Mo.) also rest in unmarked graves in this cemetery which is about one mile due north of their home in the bottom between Teuque Creek and the Missouri River (Draper Mss 21 C 18 and 21 C 19).

About a mile west of Nathan Boone's Spanish Grant #1794, Femme Osage District, St. Charles County, Mo., on the winding Femme Osage Creek, Jonathan Bryan, the second child of Rebecca Enox and James Bryan, settled on Spanish Grant #301. On the rocky hillside, about 150 yards above his home site, are three graves marked by crude, moss-covered stones. The north grave is that of James Bryan (b. 1723, Chester Co. Pa., d. Aug. 18, 1807, Femme Osage Township, St. Charles Co. Mo.), marked by the St. Charles Chapter of the DAR on Nov. 10, 1931. The south grave is that of Jonathan Bryan (b. July 15, 1759, Rowan Co. N. Car., d. Aug. 10, 1846, Femme Osage Township, St. Charles Co. Mo.). The middle grave is that of Jonathan's wife, Mary Hughes Coshow Bryan (b. 1766, d. June 15, 1826, Femme Osage Township, St. Charles Co. Mo.).

On Aug. 9, 1803, William T. Lewis married Frances Callaway, daughter of

Godfrey Krah (Crow). After he died, leaving a widow Sarah Crow, the Spanish  
Government conceded the land to Lewis Crow who in March, 1814, sold it to  
Capt. James Callaway, a grandson of Daniel Boone. In 1851, Othaniel Caleb  
Castlio, a son of John Harrison Castlio and Nancy Howell Callaway Castlio  
(widow of Capt. James Callaway) with part of the \$5,000 he had brought from  
the gold fields of California bought from the widow Stephenson 600 acres of  
land, part of which was the southeast section of Grant #424, now part of  
the Busch Wildlife Area, and part of Section 27. West of the house built by  
Thomas D. Stephenson and on a knoll above the spring and branch is the little  
Castlio burying ground. Here are buried:
